A simple list of what we can and cannot recycle.

What is Recyclable?

YES

Clean Paper:

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- White or colored paper
- All mail (even with plastic windows)
- Wrapping paper
- Cereal and other dry-food boxes
- Paper bags
- Flattened cardboard

Metal / Aluminum:

- Metal Cans
- Food Cans
- Soda Cans
- Aerosol Cans
- Foil Wrap
- Foil Trays

Plastic #'s 1, 2, 4 and 5:

- Plastic bottles and jugs
- Detergent bottles
- Plastic yogurt containers
- Plastic margarine containers
- Plastic grocery bags
- Soda Bottles

Glass:

- bottles and jars

NO

Soiled or Coated Paper:

- Plastic or wax coated paper
- Candy wrappers
- Carbon paper
- Heavily soiled paper
- Heavily soiled cardboard

Industrial Chemicals or Materials:

- Motor oil or chemical containers
- Pump spray nozzles
- Caps or lids
- Household batteries

Food Containers or Materials:

- Take-out containers
- Plastic wrap
- Sandwich wrap

Plastics #'s 3, 6 and 7:

- Dry cleaning bags
- Plastic trays or tubs
- Plastic utensils, plates, cups or bowls

Mixed Paper / Cardboard:

- Hardcover books

Styrofoam:

- Molded for packaging
- Egg cartons
- Styrofoam cups, plates, etc.
- Packing peanuts

Fragile or Broken Glass:

- Light bulbs
- Pane glass

How to Recycle...

All containers should be emptied and rinsed prior to placing them in your recycling bin. Throw away caps and lids with your regular trash.
